The Town of Saratoga is accepting Bids for the asbestos removal from the old town highway garage located on Town Garage Road, Schuylerville, NY.

Proposals will be received by the Town Clerk, Town of Saratoga, Saratoga Town Hall, 12 Spring Street, Schuylerville, NY 12871, until 4:00 p.m. on Monday, May 7, 2012. Proposals must be accompanied by the Statement of Non-Collusion in conformity with the requirements of Section 103-D of the General Municipal Law. Proposals that carry any omissions, erasures, alterations, or additions may be rejected as informal. Corporations submitting proposals shall be authorized to do business in the State of New York.

This project is subject to Article 8 of the New York State Labor Law and the Prevailing Wage Rates are applicable.

As a condition of award, within 5 work days of receipt of the proposed Contract Agreement from the Town of Saratoga; the low bidder shall return the Contract Agreement to the Town of Saratoga, properly executed, along with the Bonds if required by said Agreement. AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is dated as of the ____ day of _____ in the year 2012 by and between the TOWN OF SARATOGA and _____ (hereinafter called CONTRACTOR). TOWN OF SARATOGA and CONTRACTOR, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1. WORK

CONTRACTOR shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows:

- Asbestos Removal of the town garage located at 111 Town Garage Road, Schuylerville, NY indicated in the Alpine Environmental Services, Inc. report dated May 14, 2008 plus the vermiculite and insulation located above the ceiling. Asbestos Removal shall be removed in compliance with the NYS Department of Labor Industrial Code Rule 56 and the NYS Department of Labor Variance Petition File Number 12-0362 dated April 10, 2012.

ARTICLE 2. DELETED

ARTICLE 3. CONTRACT TIME

The Work will be completed within 28 days of the signing of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 4. CONTRACT PRICE

TOWN OF SARATOGA shall pay CONTRACTOR for completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents in current funds as follows:

ARTICLE 5. PAYMENT PROCEDURES

5.1 PROGRESS PAYMENTS

The Contractor shall submit monthly, or at more frequent intervals if permitted in writing by the contracting Officer, a requisition for a progress payment to the designated payment office for Work performed and materials furnished up to the date of the requisition, less any amount previously paid to the Contractor. Except as otherwise provided by this Contract, the Contracting Officer shall approve and cause to be paid the requisition for the progress payment less an amount necessary to satisfy any claims, liens or judgments against the Contractor which have not been suitably

discharged and less any amount authorized by law to be retained. The requisition shall be in such form and supported by such evidence as the Contracting Officer may reasonably require.

5.2 FINAL PAYMENT

Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work, the Contractor shall submit to the TOWN OF SARATOGA a requisition for payment of the remaining Contract balance. Upon receipt of this requisition, the TOWN OF SARATOGA shall, except as otherwise provided by this Contract, approve and cause such requisition to be paid less any amount necessary to satisfy any claims, liens or judgments against the Contractor which have not been suitably discharged.

ARTICLE 6. INTEREST

Any moneys not paid when due hereunder will bear no interest.

ARTICLE 7. CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

In order to induce TOWN OF SARATOGA to enter into this Agreement CONTRACTOR makes the following representations:

7.1 CONTRACTOR has familiarized him or herself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, Work, locality, and with all local conditions and Laws and Regulations that in any manner may affect cost, progress or performance of the Work.

7.2 CONTRACTOR has obtained and carefully studied (or assumes responsibility for obtaining and carefully studying) all examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports and studies which pertain to the subsurface or physical conditions at or contiguous to the site or otherwise may affect the cost, progress, performance or furnishing of the Work as CONTRACTOR considers necessary for the performance or furnishing of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Time; and no additional examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports, studies or similar information or data are or will be required by CONTRACTOR for such purposes.

7.3 CONTRACTOR has correlated the results of all such observations, examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports and studies with the terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 9. MISCELLANEOUS

- 9.1 No assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract Documents will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and specifically but without limitation, moneys that may become due and moneys that are due may not be assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents.
- 9.2 TOWN OF SARATOGA and CONTRACTOR each binds itself, its partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the other party hereto, its partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives in respect of all covenants, agreements and obligations contained in the Contract Documents.
- 9.3 INDEMNITY: To the extent permitted by law, the Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the TOWN OF SARATOGA and K A Martin Engineers, PLLC against any and all claims arising out of the negligence of the Contractor, or the negligence of any subcontractor, in the performance of this contract.
- 9.4 CONTRACTOR'S INSURANCE: No work shall commence and the Owner has the option to void the contract unless the Contractor shall secure and deliver a certificate of insurance dated within five (5) days of the date of the signing of the contract and showing that the required policies are in effect, and Contractor shall maintain such insurance policies as will protect himself, his subcontractors, and unless otherwise specified, the Owner, its agents, servants and employees and the Architect and Engineer(s) as additional named insured, from any all claims for Bodily Injuries, Death or Property Damage which may arise from operations under the contract whether such operations be by himself or by any subcontractor or anyone employed

by him directly or indirectly, or any other party who may be injured, claim injuries or die.

The insurance as required shall be written for the following limits as listed below, or greater if required by the Town of Saratoga.

Compensation Insurance:

The contractor shall procure and maintain during the life of this Contract, Workmen's Compensation for all of his employees to be engaged in the work on the project under this Contract, and in case of any such work sublet, the Contractor shall require his Subcontractor similarly to provide Workman's Compensation insurance for all the latter employees to be engaged in such work unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the Contractor's Compensation Insurance. These coverage's shall meet the Statutory Limits of New York State. Any and all proprietors, partners, executive officers and members must be covered for Workers compensation even if not required by NYS law to be covered. Certificates of Insurance must show that Workers Compensation is in effect and "N" must appear on the Certificate next to the question 'Any Proprietor/Partner/Executive Officer/Member Excluded.'

Comprehensive Commercial General Liability including Contractual, Primary and Non-Contributory:

The Contractor shall procure and maintain insurance in the following amounts:

- a. \$1,000,000-each occurrence bodily injury and property damage
- b. \$2,000,000-general aggregate
- c. \$2,000,000-products/completed operations aggregate-to be maintained for one year after final payment
- d. Include the Town of Saratoga and K A Martin Engineers, PLLC and their sub-consultants as additional insureds.

Installation Floater:

Contractor shall provide this policy in the amount of their bid to protect their interest in materials and equipment until installation is accepted by owner.

Umbrella Liability:

- a. \$2,000,000-over primary coverage
- b. Include the Town of Saratoga and K A Martin Engineers, PLLC and their sub-consultants as additional insureds.

Business Auto Liability:

ASBESTOS ABATEMENT

PART 1 GENERAL

1.01 SUMMARY

- A. This Section specifies the procedures for disturbance and removal of existing asbestos-containing materials (ACM) and disposal of removed materials. The results of the testing for ACM are listed in the Building Asbestos Survey Report attached to this specification section.
1. The Building Asbestos Survey report was compiled by an ELAP certified laboratory.
 2. In order to determine asbestos content, samples were analyzed by polarized light microscopy (PLM) and/or transmission electron microscopy (TEM).
 3. The report is intended for Town of Saratoga Design and estimate purposes only, and is included to provide bidders with the same information available to the Town.
 4. The Bulk Samples are representative of like materials in the Work area. All ACM may not have been sampled.
 5. Asbestos Removal shall be completed in compliance with the NYS Department of Labor Industrial Code Rule 56 and the NYS Department of Labor Variance Petition File Number 12-0362 dated April 10, 2012. The Variance Petition is included as an appendix
- D. Type of Asbestos Abatement Project:
1. Large Asbestos Abatement Project: An asbestos project involving the removal, disturbance, repair or handling of more than 160 square feet or 260 linear feet of ACM.

 2. Asbestos Removal Company Data: Name and address of proposed asbestos removal company and abatement contractor license issued by DOL.
 3. Asbestos Worker Certification Data: Name and address of proposed asbestos abatement workers and licenses issued by DOL.
 4. Work Plan: For information only, submit one copy of the work plan required under Quality Assurance Article.
 5. Waste Transporter Permit: One copy of transporter's current waste transporter permit from NYS DEC (NYS Part 364 Permit).
 6. Landfill: Landfill to be used for ACM disposal shall be licensed to receive asbestos waste by NYS DEC (NYS Part 360 Permit) and by USEPA. Out of state landfills shall provide licenses from local agencies having jurisdiction.
 7. Negative Air Pressure Equipment: Copy of manufacturer's and performance data of all units and HEPA filters used.
- C. Asbestos Work Closeout Submittals:
1. Waste Shipment Records and Disposal Site Receipts: Copy of waste shipment record and disposal site receipt showing that the ACM has been properly disposed.
 - a. Waste shipment record and disposal site receipt must be received within 35 days of the ACM waste leaving the Site. If receipts are not received within the specified time period, the Town of Saratoga's Representative will notify USEPA in writing within 45 days of the ACM waste leaving the Site.
- D. Contract Closeout Submittals:
1. Daily Log: Submit copy of Project Monitor's daily air sample log and a copy of Asbestos Abatement Contractor's Daily project log.
 2. Air Monitoring Data: Submit copy of air test results and chain of custody.

1.08 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. Regulatory Requirements: Comply with the referenced standards.
- B. Pre-Work Conference: Before the Work of this Section is scheduled to commence, a conference will be held by the Director's Representative at the Site for the purpose of reviewing the Contract Documents, discussing requirements for the Work, and reviewing the Work procedures.
 - 1. The conference shall be attended by the asbestos removal contractor, and the testing laboratory employed by the Town.
- C. Work Plan: At the conclusion of the pre-work conference, before the physical abatement Work begins, prepare a detailed work plan.
 - 1. The work plan shall include, but not be limited to, work procedures, types of equipment, details of equipment used, decontamination unit locations, crew size, and emergency procedures for fire and medical emergencies and for failure of containment barriers.
 - 2. A site specific variance has been obtained, finalize the work plan based upon the Department of Labor decision is received.

1.09 PROJECT CONDITIONS

- A. In addition to the postings required by law, post at the entrance to the abatement area the following documents:
 - 1. Copy of the printed Work plan.
 - 2. Copy of Industrial Code Rule 56.
- B. Contractor is to provide and maintain electric services to the project work area for his use. Follow all regulations for electric power shut down exemptions as per DOL regulations.
- C. Do not obstruct any aisle or passageway so as to reduce its required width as an exit.

1.10 HEALTH AND SAFETY

- A. Where in the performance of the work, workers, supervisory personnel or sub-contractors may encounter, disturb, or otherwise function in the immediate vicinity of contaminated items and materials, all personnel shall take appropriate continuous measures

as necessary to protect all ancillary building occupants from the potential ACM exposure.

- A. Type: Local exhaust system, capable of maintaining negative air pressure within the containment, and provides for HEPA filtration of efficiency not less than 99.97 percent with 0.3 micron particles. Equip the unit with filter alarms lights and operation time meter.

2.06 PLASTIC SHEETS

- A. Type: Minimum 6 mil thick, clear, fire retardant polyethylene.

2.07 RESPIRATORS

- A. Type: As approved by the Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA), Department of Labor, or the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), Department of Health and Human Services.

2.08 VACUUM CLEANERS

- A. Type: Vacuums equipped with HEPA filters.

PART 3 EXECUTION

3.01 ASBESTOS-CONTAINING MATERIAL HANDLING AND REMOVAL PROCEDURES

- A. Comply with the standards referenced in Part 1 of this Section.

3.02 CLEAN UP PROCEDURES

- A. Comply with the standards referenced in Part 1 of this Section.

3.03 PROJECT AIR SAMPLING, MONITORING AND ANALYSIS

- A. Air Sampling and Analysis: The Town of Saratoga will employ the services of an independent testing laboratory to perform air sample monitoring. The laboratory shall use the methods described in standards referenced in Part 1 of this Section.
 - 1. The equipment, duration, flow rate, calibration of equipment, number and location of samples are as per ICR 56-4 and Variance Petition 12-0362.
 - 2. Air sampling technician shall be on site to observe and maintain air sampling equipment for the duration of the air sampling collection.
 - 3. Period of time permitted between completion of air sample collection and receipt of results on the project site shall be equal or less than 48 hours.
- B. If air samples collected outside the regulated work area indicate airborne fiber concentrations at or above 0.01 fibers per cubic centimeter, or the established background level, which ever is greater, work shall stop immediately for inspection of barriers and negative air ventilation systems. Clean up surfaces outside the regulated work area using HEPA filter equipped vacuums and wet cleaning methods. Work methods shall be altered to reduce fiber concentrations to acceptable levels.
- C. Elevated air sample results, if any, along with background and all other air sample results collected during Phase IIA through Phase IIC shall be submitted to the Commissioner of appropriate Asbestos Control Bureau within the same business day of receipt of results.

3.04 FINAL CLEANING AND CLEARANCE PROCEDURES

- A. Negative Pressure Ventilation: Negative air pressure machines if used, shall remain in continuous operation during the length of the project as required by the Petition Variance.
- B. Cleaning and Visual Inspection: After first, second, third cleaning and required waiting/settling and drying periods, perform a final visual inspection.
 - 1. Final clearance air sampling shall commence after the waiting/settling and drying time as per ICR 56 has elapsed.

- C. Project Monitor Visual Inspection: The Town of Saratoga will employ the services of a DOL certified asbestos project monitor employed by an independent testing laboratory to perform visual inspection as required by ICR 56.

- D. Final Clearance Air Sampling: The Town of Saratoga will employ the services of an independent testing laboratory to perform final air sampling.
 - 1. The laboratory shall use the methods described in standards referenced in Part 1 of this Section.
 - 2. The equipment, duration, flow rate, calibration of equipment, number and location of samples are as per ICR 56-4.
 - 3. If initial Post-Abatement (Clearance Air) Monitoring results do not comply with the standards referenced in Part 1 of this Section the Contractor shall either re-clean or order a full set of TEM analysis.
 - a. Results of the TEM analysis will be conclusive, and if the results do not comply with the standards referenced in Part 1 of this Section, the Contractor shall re-clean and additional full set of air samples will be collected and analyzed until the standards are met.
 - b. All satisfactory PCM clearance air sample results along with background air sample results, if they are greater than or equal to 0.01 fibers per cubic centimeter, shall be submitted to the Commissioner of appropriate Asbestos Control Bureau within two business days of receipt of satisfactory clearance air results.
 - c. All satisfactory TEM results of previously unsatisfactory PCM clearance air sample results, along with the unsatisfactory PCM results shall be submitted to the Commissioner of appropriate Asbestos Control Bureau within two business days of receipt of satisfactory clearance air results.
 - 4. Prior to removal of isolation barriers the Town of Saratoga's Representative at the site will receive an affidavit from the air monitoring laboratory certifying the final air samples comply with the standards referenced in Part 1 of this Section.

5. In addition to the Phase Contrast Microscopy (PCM) method of analysis required by Industrial Code Rule 56 a full set of Transmission Electron Microscopy (TEM) shall be performed by the testing laboratory for the Post-Abatement (Clearance Air) Monitoring.
- E. Dismantling of Regulated Abatement Work Area:
1. Remove all tools and equipment after proper decontamination as per Part 1 of this section.
 2. Dismantle and remove each tent enclosure and air lock and any barriers only after final clearance air monitoring has been performed and satisfactory results obtained.
 3. All remaining polyethylene, duct tape, expandable foam and other barrier materials shall be bagged, wrapped, containerized and labeled as asbestos waste.
 4. Remove all temporary hard walled barriers from site.
 5. Dismantle any remote decontamination units and plastic sheeting shall be disposed as asbestos waste.
 6. Remove all waste generated to the holding area, lockable trailer or dumpster.
 7. Contractor's Supervisor shall certify in writing to the Town of Saratoga that abatement work is complete and no debris/residue remains.

3.05 DISPOSAL OF ASBESTOS-CONTAINING MATERIAL AND RELATED DEBRIS

- A. Remove all waste generated as part of the asbestos project from the project site within ten calendar days from the site after completion of Phase IIC of the project or within one day of the waste disposal container/trailer becomes full, whichever occurs first.
- B. Transport and dispose of all the asbestos-containing waste, related debris, and waste water to the approved disposal site.
- C. All generated waste removed from the site must be documented, accounted for and disposed of in compliance with the requirements of USEPA NESHAP.
- D. Comply also with the standards referenced in Part 1 of this Section.

3.06 RESTORATION

- A. Remove temporary decontamination facilities and restore area designated for these facilities to its original condition or better.
- B. Where existing work is damaged or contaminated, restore work to its original condition or better.

Upon considering the merits of the alleged practical difficulties or unnecessary hardship and upon the record herein, the Commissioner of Labor does hereby take the following actions:

VARIANCE GRANTED. The Petitioner's proposal for cleanup of 5500 sq. ft. of asbestos debris followed by removal of 6750 sq. ft. of transite panels and 5500 sq. ft. of vermiculite from the building interior, followed by controlled demolition removal of 9450 sq. ft. of non-friable ACM roofing, at the subject premises in accordance with the attached 8-page stamped copy of the Petitioner's submittal, is accepted; subject to the Conditions noted below:

THE CONDITIONS


1. A full time Project Monitor shall be on-site during the entire project to observe the abatement work practices and to ensure that no visible emissions are observed during the cleanup and removal activities.
2. Prior to removal of ACM debris, installation of critical barriers as per ICR 56-7.11 (a) and installation of negative air ventilation as per ICR 56-7.8 shall be completed. All visible accumulations of ACM in the area of the critical barriers shall be cleaned as per ICR 56-7.10 (c)(1) prior to installation of the barriers.
3. Negative air pressure equipment shall be installed and operated continuously during the interior cleanup and abatement project. However, the it is not required to maintain -0.02 column inches of water pressure differential and to observe the pre-abatement settling period as per 56-8.2(b) once the negative air has been established.
4. The petitioner shall comply with ICR 56-8.4(e) and ICR 56-8.9 for waste generated from interior cleanup and removal of interior transite and vermiculite.
5. Usage of this variance is limited to those asbestos removals identified in this variance or as outlined in the Petitioner's proposal.

In addition to the conditions required by the above specific variances, the Petitioner shall also comply with the following general conditions:

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. A copy of this DECISION and the Petitioner's proposals shall be conspicuously displayed at the entrance to the personal decontamination enclosure.
2. This DECISION shall apply only to the removal of asbestos-containing materials from the aforementioned areas of the subject premises.
3. The Petitioner shall comply with all other applicable provisions of Industrial Code Rule 56-1 through 56-12.
4. The NYS Department of Labor Engineering Service Unit retains full authority to interpret this variance for compliance herewith and for compliance with Labor Law Article 30. Any deviation to the conditions leading to this variance shall render this variance Null and Void pursuant to 12NYCRR 56-12.2. Any questions regarding the conditions supporting the need for this variance and/or regarding compliance hereto must be directed to the Engineering Services Unit for clarification.
5. This DECISION shall terminate on April 30, 2013.

Answer to Questions 9 & 10

There is hardship with complying with the provisions of the New York State Department of Labor's Industrial Code Rule 56 due to the size and locations of the work areas, and the type of work being performed. The Town of Saratoga Highway Department would like to completely abate the former Highway Garage, removing the asbestos roof, transite ceiling/wall panels, vermiculite insulation, debris and contaminated materials, but keep the exterior block walls, and the steel structure supporting the block walls. The roof and ceiling of this building are in poor condition. There is transite debris and vermiculite debris at the interior of the building. Alpine considers the entire interior of the garage building to be contaminated with transite and vermiculite debris. It would be impractical and unsafe to require manual removal of the roofing materials on the main roof.

We are specifically requesting relief from the following items of the Industrial Code Rule 56.

Case # 1 ICR 56-4.8 (a) Area Air Sample Analysis Results – General Requirements → Denied
We are requesting relief from the requirement to post air sample results on non-work days. P&P

Case # 2 ICR 56-5.1 (h) Removal Required → Not Applicable for interior. 4/9/12
It is impractical to require abatement of all asbestos containing materials from the roof prior to demolition of the roof system. The wooden roof decking is in poor condition and unsafe for manual removal of asbestos containing roofing materials.

Case # 3 ICR 56-7.8 Engineering Controls → Limited (See variance conditions)
The roof and ceiling of this building are in poor condition. The ceiling is to be removed as part of the interior asbestos abatement project. Due to the poor condition of the roof and ceiling, it is impractical to apply critical/isolation barriers to the holes in the roof deck, and establish negative pressure within the removal area. Asbestos materials will be kept wetted, and openings on the first floor of the garage are to be plasticized to prevent asbestos fibers from escaping from the removal area during clean-up of the floor and wall surfaces, and abatement of the ceiling materials. P&P 4/9/12

Case # 4 ICR 56-7.11(b) Isolation Barriers
The garage door openings are twelve (12) feet high by twelve (12) feet wide. One of the doors had been removed. It is impractical to construct hardwall barriers to completely cover the entire garage door opening. We are requesting approval to construct hardwall barriers to a height of eight feet at

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this location. The entire opening shall be sealed with two layers of six (6) mil fire retardant plastic sheeting.

Case # 5 ICR 56-7.11(e) Floor, Wall, & Ceiling Plasticizing and Sealing

It is impractical to plasticize floors, walls, ceilings, and other contaminated surfaces to remove asbestos containing debris and contamination. Isolation barriers will be constructed and critical barriers shall be sealed with two (2) layers of 6-mil fire retardant plastic sheeting. Asbestos containing and asbestos contaminated materials will be removed using manual wet methods. Asbestos materials will be kept wetted, and openings on the first floor of the garage are to be plasticized to prevent asbestos fibers from escaping from the removal area during clean-up of the floor and wall surfaces, and abatement of the ceiling materials.

Case # 6 ICR 56-8.2 (b) Waiting Periods

The roof and ceiling of this building are in poor condition. The ceiling is to be removed as part of the interior asbestos abatement project. Due to the poor condition of the roof and ceiling, it is impractical to apply critical/isolation barriers to the holes in the roof deck, and establish negative pressure within the removal area. Therefore we are requesting relief from the four (4) hour pre-abatement waiting period.

Case # 7 ICR 56-8.9(g) Trailers and Dumpsters

Since asbestos containing/contaminated roofing materials waste is to be placed in the waste trailers/dumpsters using excavators or other heavy equipment, it is impractical to use hard topped dumpsters. Dumpsters will be open topped during the workday to allow placing waste materials inside. A temporary hard top will be placed on and secured to the waste trailer/dumpster during non-work hours.

Case # 8 ICR 56-11.5 (c,7) Controlled Demolition Procedures - Debris

It is impractical and cost burdensome to dispose of the roofing demolition debris as regulated asbestos waste. An inspection was performed and only non-friable asbestos containing roofing materials were found.

In order to perform the asbestos removal work in a manner to protect the safety and health of the public, we are proposing to perform the asbestos removal work as detailed in the following work procedure. This variance petition reflects the necessary work changes needed to accommodate these circumstances.

PROPOSED PROCEDURES (Answer to Question 11)

Part 1: Materials Addressed: Asbestos Containing/Contaminated Debris Clean-up, and Transite, Vermiculite, Contaminated Ceiling Materials, and Fiberglass Insulation Removal

- 1] The regulated abatement work area shall be established as per the requirements of ICR 56-7.4.
- 2] Personal and Waste Decontamination systems, meeting the requirements of ICR 56-7.5, shall be constructed and utilized for this project. The decontamination systems shall be attached to the regulated abatement work area. The decontamination systems shall be cordoned off at a distance of twenty-five (25) feet, except where physical restrictions limit the barrier distance (property boundary, roadway/right-of-way, building/structure). Decontamination systems accessible to the public shall be fully framed and hardwall sheathed. The regulated abatement work area shall remain vacated except for certified workers until the abatement project is complete.

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- 3] For areas where compliance with the twenty-five (25) foot barrier requirement isn't possible, the areas shall be cordoned off to the maximum distance possible and a daily abatement air sample shall be included within ten (10) feet of the reduced barrier.
- 4] After the installation of the personal/waste decontamination system, full PPE shall be worn within the regulated abatement work area during preparation activities.
- 5] Isolation barriers and critical barriers shall be installed to seal off all openings including, but not limited to, operable windows, doorways, ducts, grills, diffusers, etc., within the regulated abatement work area on the first floor level only. ~~Due to the poor condition of the roof and ceiling, it is impractical to apply critical/isolation barriers to the holes in the roof deck, and establish negative pressure within the removal area.~~ *whenever possible shall be installed and* *ppp*

- 6] Critical barriers shall consist of two (2) layers of six (6) mil fire retardant plastic sheeting. Locations where critical barriers are to be installed shall be cleaned using HEPA vacuuming or wet wiping prior to installation of the barriers.

The lower eight feet of any isolation barriers shall be fully framed and hardwall sheathed. The entire opening shall be sealed with two layers of six (6) mil fire retardant plastic sheeting.
- 8] All floor and wall surfaces within the regulated work area are presumed to be contaminated. All debris shall be presumed to be asbestos containing or asbestos contaminated debris and cleaned up as part of the abatement work after barriers are sealed. All floors, walls, movable, and fixed objects within the work area, contaminated with asbestos debris, shall be cleaned as part of this project. All non-cleanable asbestos contaminated materials shall be misted with amended water and containerized for disposal.
- 9] All asbestos containing/contaminated debris shall be cleaned up after construction of the containment is completed. All visible asbestos debris shall be misted with amended water and bagged for disposal.
- 10] Amended water shall be used to thoroughly wet the asbestos containing/contaminated materials during abatement. Materials removed shall be containerized and secured airtight prior to transport to the decontamination unit.
- 11] After completion of the clean-up of the regulated area, the remaining asbestos containing transite, presumed asbestos vermiculite, and contaminated ceiling materials shall be removed using gross abatement methods. A drop cloth consisting of at least one layer of 6-mil fire retardant plastic sheeting shall be placed on the floor beneath remaining asbestos containing materials to be removed.
- 12] One thorough final cleaning and one post-abatement settling period shall suffice unless final clearance air results fail.
- 13] Following the completion of the asbestos containing debris removal, contamination cleanup, and remaining asbestos containing/contaminated materials removal, the regulated area shall be thoroughly inspected by the asbestos project monitor. If the area is found to be dry and free of asbestos containing materials and contamination, PCM and/or TEM clearance samples shall be collected in accordance with the requirements of ICR 56.

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Part 2: Materials Addressed: Asbestos Containing Roofing Removal (Built-up, Roll-on, and Shingle Roofs)

- 1] The entire roofing removal area at the work site shall be considered the regulated abatement work area and shall be enclosed within a barrier to prevent unauthorized entry. The active demolition area shall be cordoned off at a distance of twenty-five (25) feet, except where physical restrictions limit the barrier distance (property boundary, roadway/right-of-way, building/structure). The regulated abatement work area shall remain vacated except for certified workers until the abatement project is complete.
- 2] For areas where compliance with the twenty-five (25) foot barrier requirement isn't possible, the areas shall be cordoned off to the maximum distance possible and a daily abatement air sample shall be included within ten (10) feet of the reduced barrier.
- 3] Signage in accordance with the requirements of ICR 56-7.4(c) shall be posted on the exterior of the work site boundary fence/barrier to warn the public of the asbestos hazard.
- 4] Personal decontamination system enclosures shall be constructed and used per the requirements of ICR 56-7.5(d). Equipment decontamination areas shall be established and used per ICR 56-11.5.
- 5] All building openings within the regulated abatement area shall be sealed with two (2) layers of six (6) mil fire retardant plastic sheeting. Isolation barriers shall consist of hard walled framing on the lower eight feet, and two layers of six (6) mil fire retardant plastic sheeting.
- 6] Entry/Exit of all persons and equipment shall be through designated and controlled "access way(s)" in the barrier or fence, which shall provide an adequate and appropriate means of egress from the regulated work area.
- 7] Non-certified personnel shall not be allowed to access any regulated abatement work area, with the exception of waste transporter truck drivers. These drivers will be restricted to their enclosed cab, while temporarily in the regulated work area for waste transfer purposes only.
- 8] No dry disturbance or removal of asbestos containing materials shall be allowed. Wastewater shall be confined to the controlled demolition regulated abatement work area. All wastewater shall be collected by means of trenching, ditches, or berms made of solid absorbent material or similar method. Disposal of such wastewater shall be in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, etc.
- 9] Non-friable roofing materials will be removed mechanically utilizing a grapple or other heavy equipment. Smaller roofs may be removed using manual methods. All asbestos containing/contaminated roofing debris will be disposed of as non-friable asbestos waste.
- 10] All asbestos containing/contaminated demolition debris, used filters, and similar items shall be transported and disposed of by appropriate legal methods. Structural members, steel components, and similar non-asbestos components, shall be fully decontaminated as per ICR 56, prior to being treated as salvage.

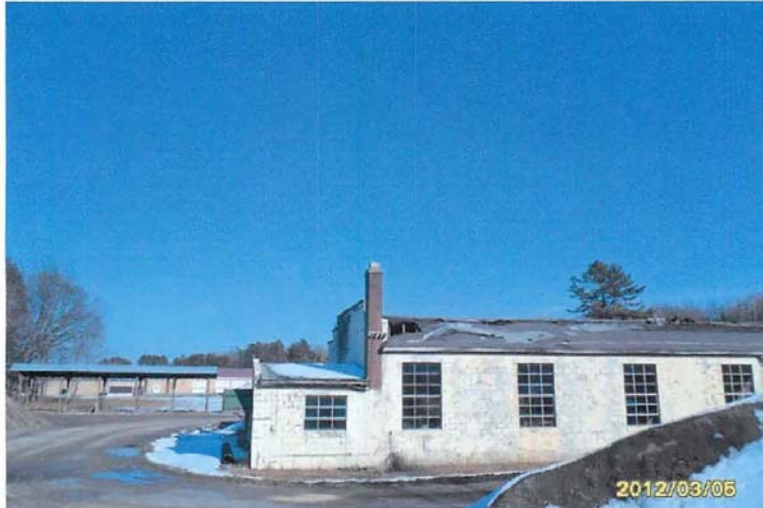
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- 11] Roofing demolition waste shall be wetted prior to, during and subsequent to its collection and removal. Fog nozzles or similar equipment shall be used to perform the wetting. Piles of waste not actively being worked on shall be covered with at least one (1) layer of six (6) mil polyethylene.
- 12] All asbestos containing/contaminated roofing waste shall be placed in hard-wall closed containers lined with at least two (2) layers of six (6) mil fire retardant plastic sheeting. Waste containers shall be sealed airtight prior to transport from the site.
- 13] All roofing removal/demolition debris and roof structure debris on the interior and exterior of the building shall be cleaned up. This debris will be considered contaminated with non-friable asbestos containing materials and disposed of accordingly.
- 14] Block walls are to remain in place, and cleaned of any presumed asbestos contamination as part of the asbestos abatement project. *Non-friable*

- 15] Final clean-up and clearance procedures shall comply with ICR 56-9, except only one stage of cleaning is to be performed.
- 16] The surface below the equipment decontamination area and debris piles shall be scraped/cleaned and any residual asbestos contamination shall be removed and disposed of in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, etc.
- 17] In addition to the requirements of ICR 56-4.9(c), air monitoring within the work areas shall be conducted daily as per ICR 56-11.5. If more than one daily shift is required to accomplish the work, air monitoring shall be performed on each shift.
- 18] Daily abatement air monitoring shall be required only on days when abatement or support activities such as ACM disturbance or cleaning activities are performed.
- 19] In lieu of post abatement clearance air monitoring in compliance with ICR 56-9.2(d), the most recent daily abatement air samples collected during removal and cleaning operations in the regulated abatement work area, shall be used for comparison with ICR 56-4.11 clearance criteria.
- 20] After removal and cleanings are complete, an authorized and qualified Project Monitor, independent of the Abatement Contractor, shall determine if the area is dry and free of visible asbestos debris as per ICR 56-9.1(d)(1). If the area is determined to be acceptable, and the most recent daily abatement air sample results meet ICR 56-4.11 clearance criteria, final dismantling of the regulated abatement work area may begin.

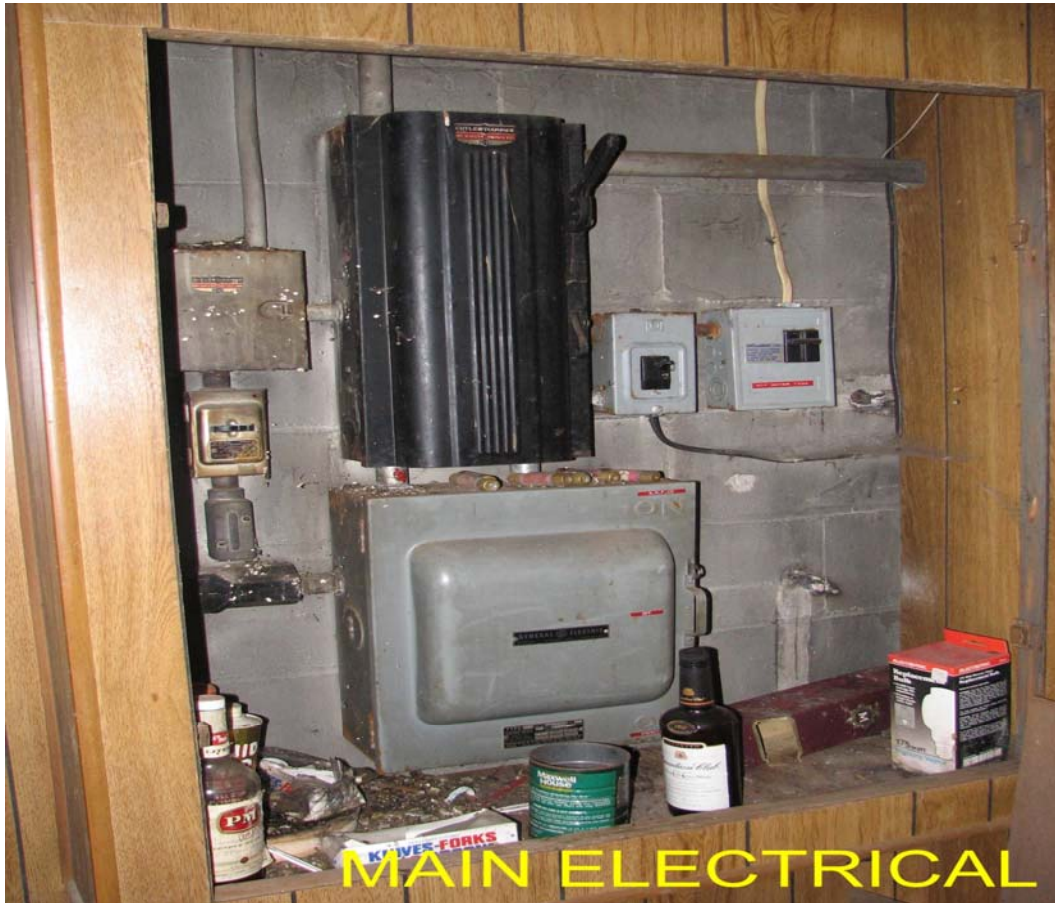

General Provisions of Laws Covering Workers on Article 8 Public Work Contracts

Introduction

The Labor Law requires public work contractors and subcontractors to pay laborers, workers, or mechanics employed in the performance of a public work contract not less than the prevailing rate of wage and supplements (fringe benefits) in the locality where the work is performed.

Responsibilities of the Department of Jurisdiction

A Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) includes a state department, agency, board or commission; a county, city, town or village; a school district, board of education or board of cooperative educational services; a sewer, water, fire, improvement and other district corporation; a public benefit corporation; and a public authority awarding a public work contract.

The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) awarding a public work contract MUST obtain a Prevailing Rate Schedule listing the hourly rates of wages and supplements due the workers to be employed on a public work project. This schedule may be obtained by completing and forwarding a "Request for wage and Supplement Information" form (PW 39) to the Bureau of Public Work. The Prevailing Rate Schedule MUST be included in the specifications for the contract to be awarded and is deemed part of the public work contract.

Upon the awarding of the contract, the law requires that the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) furnish the following information to the Bureau: the name and address of the contractor, the date the contract was let and the approximate dollar value of the contract. To facilitate compliance with this provision of the Labor Law, a copy of the Department's "Notice of Contract Award" form (PW 16) is provided with the original Prevailing Rate Schedule.

The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) is required to notify the Bureau of the completion or cancellation of any public work project. The Department's PW 200 form is provided for that purpose.

Both the PW 16 and PW 200 forms are available for completion [online](#).

Hours

No laborer, worker, or mechanic in the employ of a contractor or subcontractor engaged in the performance of any public work project shall be permitted to work more than eight hours in any day or more than five days in any week, except in cases of extraordinary emergency. The contractor and the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) may apply to the Bureau of Public Work for a dispensation permitting workers to work additional hours or days per week on a particular public work project.

There are very few exceptions to this rule. Complete information regarding these exceptions is available on the "[4 Day / 10 Hour Work Schedule](#)" form (PW 30R).

Wages and Supplements

The wages and supplements to be paid and/or provided to laborers, workers, and mechanics employed on a public work project shall be not less than those listed in the current Prevailing Rate Schedule for the locality where the work is performed. If a prime contractor on a public work project has not been provided with a Prevailing Rate Schedule, the contractor must notify the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) who in turn must request an original Prevailing Rate Schedule form the Bureau of Public Work. Requests may be submitted by: mail to NYSDOL, Bureau of Public Work, State Office Bldg. Campus, Bldg. 12, Rm. 130, Albany, NY 12240; Fax to Bureau of Public Work (518) 485-1870; or electronically at the NYSDOL website www.labor.state.ny.us.

Upon receiving the original schedule, the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) is REQUIRED to provide complete copies to all prime contractors who in turn MUST, by law, provide copies of all applicable county schedules to each subcontractor and obtain from each subcontractor, an affidavit certifying such schedules were received. If the original schedule expired, the contractor may obtain a copy of the new annual determination from the NYSDOL website www.labor.state.ny.us.

The Commissioner of Labor makes an annual determination of the prevailing rates. This determination is in effect from July 1st through June 30th of the following year. The annual determination is available on the NYSDOL website www.labor.state.ny.us.

Payrolls and Payroll Records

Every contractor and subcontractor MUST keep original payrolls or transcripts subscribed and affirmed as true under penalty of perjury. Payrolls must be maintained for at least three (3) years from the project's date of completion. At a minimum, payrolls must show the following information for each person employed on a public work project: Name, Address, Last 4 Digits of Social Security Number, Classification(s) in which the worker was employed, Hourly wage rate(s) paid, Supplements paid or provided, and Daily and weekly number of hours worked in each classification.

Every contractor and subcontractor shall submit to the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency), within thirty (30) days after issuance of its first payroll and every thirty (30) days thereafter, a transcript of the original payrolls, subscribed and affirmed as true under penalty of perjury. The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) shall collect, review for facial validity, and maintain such payrolls.

In addition, the Commissioner of Labor may require contractors to furnish, with ten (10) days of a request, payroll records sworn to as their validity and accuracy for public work and private work. Payroll records include, but are not limited to time cards, work description sheets, proof that supplements were provided, cancelled payroll checks and payrolls. Failure to provide the requested information within the allotted ten (10) days will result in the withholding of up to 25% of the contract, not to exceed \$100,000.00. If the contractor or subcontractor does not maintain a place of business in New York State and the amount of the contract exceeds \$25,000.00, payroll records and certifications must be kept on the project worksite.

The prime contractor is responsible for any underpayments of prevailing wages or supplements by any subcontractor.

All contractors or their subcontractors shall provide to their subcontractors a copy of the Prevailing Rate Schedule specified in the public work contract as well as any subsequently issued schedules. A failure to provide these schedules by a contractor or subcontractor is a violation of Article 8, Section 220-a of the Labor Law.

All subcontractors engaged by a public work project contractor or its subcontractor, upon receipt of the original schedule and any subsequently issued schedules, shall provide to such contractor a verified statement attesting that the subcontractor has received the Prevailing Rate Schedule and will pay or provide the applicable rates of wages and supplements specified therein. (See NYS Labor Laws, Article 8 . Section 220-a).

Determination of Prevailing Wage and Supplement Rate Updates Applicable to All Counties

The wages and supplements contained in the annual determination become effective July 1st whether or not the new determination has been received by a given contractor. Care should be taken to review the rates for obvious errors. Any corrections should be brought to the Department's attention immediately. It is the responsibility of the public work contractor to use the proper rates. If there is a question on the proper classification to be used, please call the district office located nearest the project. Any errors in the annual determination will be corrected and posted to the NYSDOL website on the first business day of each month. Contractors are responsible for paying these updated rates as well, retroactive to July 1st.

When you review the schedule for a particular occupation, your attention should be directed to the dates above the column of rates. These are the dates for which a given set of rates is effective. To the extent possible, the Department posts rates in its possession that cover periods of time beyond the July 1st to June 30th time frame covered by a particular annual determination. Rates that extend beyond that instant time period are informational ONLY and may be updated in future annual determinations that actually cover the then appropriate July 1st to June 30th time period.

Withholding of Payments

When a complaint is filed with the Commissioner of Labor alleging the failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay or provide the prevailing wages or supplements, or when the Commissioner of Labor believes that unpaid wages or supplements may be due, payments on the public work contract shall be withheld from the prime contractor in a sufficient amount to satisfy the alleged unpaid wages and supplements, including interest and civil penalty, pending a final determination.

When the Bureau of Public Work finds that a contractor or subcontractor on a public work project failed to pay or provide the requisite prevailing wages or supplements, the Bureau is authorized by Sections 220-b and 235.2 of the Labor Law to so notify the financial officer of the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) that awarded the public work contract. Such officer MUST then withhold or cause to be withheld from any payment due the prime contractor on account of such contract the amount indicated by the Bureau as sufficient to satisfy the unpaid wages and supplements, including interest and any civil penalty that may be assessed by the Commissioner of Labor. The withholding continues until there is a final determination of the underpayment by the Commissioner of Labor or by the court in the event a legal proceeding is instituted for review of the determination of the Commissioner of Labor.

The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) shall comply with this order of the Commissioner of Labor or of the court with respect to the release of the funds so withheld.

Summary of Notice Posting Requirements

The current Prevailing Rate Schedule must be posted in a prominent and accessible place on the site of the public work project. The prevailing wage schedule must be encased in, or constructed of, materials capable of withstanding adverse weather conditions and be titled "PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES" in letters no smaller than two (2) inches by two (2) inches.

The "[Public Work Project](#)" notice must be posted at the beginning of the performance of every public work contract, on each job site.

Every employer providing workers. compensation insurance and disability benefits must post notices of such coverage in the format prescribed by the Workers. Compensation Board in a conspicuous place on the jobsite.

Every employer subject to the NYS Human Rights Law must conspicuously post at its offices, places of employment, or employment training centers, notices furnished by the State Division of Human Rights.

Employers liable for contributions under the Unemployment Insurance Law must conspicuously post on the jobsite notices furnished by the NYS Department of Labor.

Apprentices

Employees cannot be paid apprentice rates unless they are individually registered in a program registered with the NYS Commissioner of Labor. The allowable ratio of apprentices to journeyworkers in any craft classification can be no greater than the statewide building trade ratios promulgated by the Department of Labor and included with the Prevailing Rate Schedule. An employee listed on a payroll as an apprentice who is not registered as above or is performing work outside the classification of work for which the apprentice is indentured, must be paid the prevailing journeyworker's wage rate for the classification of work the employee is actually performing.

NYSDOL Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-3, require that only apprentices individually registered with the NYS Department of Labor may be paid apprenticeship rates on a public work project. No other Federal or State Agency of office registers apprentices in New York State.

Persons wishing to verify the apprentice registration of any person must do so in writing by mail, to the NYSDOL Office of Employability Development / Apprenticeship Training, State Office Bldg. Campus, Bldg. 12, Albany, NY 12240 or by Fax to NYSDOL Apprenticeship Training (518) 457-7154. All requests for verification must include the name and social security number of the person for whom the information is requested.

The only conclusive proof of individual apprentice registration is written verification from the NYSDOL Apprenticeship Training Albany Central office. Neither Federal nor State Apprenticeship Training offices outside of Albany can provide conclusive registration information.

It should be noted that the existence of a registered apprenticeship program is not conclusive proof that any person is registered in that program. Furthermore, the existence or possession of wallet cards, identification cards, or copies of state forms is not conclusive proof of the registration of any person as an apprentice.

Interest and Penalties

In the event that an underpayment of wages and/or supplements is found:

- Interest shall be assessed at the rate then in effect as prescribed by the Superintendent of Banks pursuant to section 14-a of the Banking Law, per annum from the date of underpayment to the date restitution is made.
- A Civil Penalty may also be assessed, not to exceed 25% of the total of wages, supplements, and interest due.

Debarment

Any contractor or subcontractor and/or its successor shall be ineligible to submit a bid on or be awarded any public work contract or subcontract with any state, municipal corporation or public body for a period of five (5) years when:

- Two (2) willful determinations have been rendered against that contractor or subcontractor and/or its successor within any consecutive six (6) year period.
- There is any willful determination that involves the falsification of payroll records or the kickback of wages or supplements.

Criminal Sanctions

Willful violations of the Prevailing Wage Law (Article 8 of the Labor Law) may be a felony punishable by fine or imprisonment of up to 15 years, or both.

Discrimination

No employee or applicant for employment may be discriminated against on account of age, race, creed, color, national origin, sex, disability or marital status.

No contractor, subcontractor nor any person acting on its behalf, shall by reason of race, creed, color, disability, sex or national origin discriminate against any citizen of the State of New York who is qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(a)).

No contractor, subcontractor, nor any person acting on its behalf, shall in any manner, discriminate against or intimidate any employee on account of race, creed, color, disability, sex, or national origin (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(b)).

The Human Rights Law also prohibits discrimination in employment because of age, marital status, or religion.

There may be deducted from the amount payable to the contractor under the contract a penalty of \$50.00 for each calendar day during which such person was discriminated against or intimidated in violation of the provision of the contract (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(c)).

The contract may be cancelled or terminated by the State or municipality. All monies due or to become due thereunder may be forfeited for a second or any subsequent violation of the terms or conditions of the anti-discrimination sections of the contract (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(d)).

Every employer subject to the New York State Human Rights Law must conspicuously post at its offices, places of employment, or employment training centers notices furnished by the State Division of Human Rights.

Workers' Compensation

In accordance with Section 142 of the State Finance Law, the contractor shall maintain coverage during the life of the contract for the benefit of such employees as required by the provisions of the New York State Workers' Compensation Law.

A contractor who is awarded a public work contract must provide proof of workers' compensation coverage prior to being allowed to begin work.

The insurance policy must be issued by a company authorized to provide workers' compensation coverage in New York State. Proof of coverage must be on form C-105.2 (Certificate of Workers' Compensation Insurance) and must name this agency as a certificate holder.

If New York State coverage is added to an existing out-of-state policy, it can only be added to a policy from a company authorized to write workers' compensation coverage in this state. The coverage must be listed under item 3A of the information page.

The contractor must maintain proof that subcontractors doing work covered under this contract secured and maintained a workers' compensation policy for all employees working in New York State.

Every employer providing worker's compensation insurance and disability benefits must post notices of such coverage in the format prescribed by the Workers' Compensation Board in a conspicuous place on the jobsite.

Unemployment Insurance

Employers liable for contributions under the Unemployment Insurance Law must conspicuously post on the jobsite notices furnished by the New York State Department of Labor.

Social Security Numbers on Certified Payrolls

The Department of Labor is cognizant of the concerns of the potential for misuse or inadvertent disclosure of social security numbers. Identity theft is a growing problem and we are sympathetic to contractors' concerns with regard to inclusion of this information on payrolls if another identifier will suffice.

For these reasons, *the substitution of the use of the last four digits of the social security number on certified payrolls submitted to contracting agencies on public work projects is now acceptable to the Department of Labor.*

NOTE: This change does not affect the Department's ability to request and receive the entire social security number from employers during the course of its public work / prevailing wage investigations.

Public Work Enforcement Fund

effective date December 7, 2005

1. Purpose and Scope:

This Item describes the Public Work Enforcement Fund (the Fund, PWEF) and its relevance to State agencies and public benefit corporations engaged in construction or reconstruction contracts, maintenance and repair, and announces the recently-enacted increase to the percentage of the dollar value of such contracts that must be deposited into the Fund. This item also describes the roles of the following entities with respect to the Fund:

- New York State Department of Labor (DOL),
- The Office of the State of Comptroller (OSC), and
- State agencies and public benefit corporations.

2. Background and Statutory References:

DOL uses the Fund to enforce the State's Labor Law as it relates to contracts for construction or reconstruction, maintenance and repair, as defined in subdivision two of Section 220 of the Labor Law. State agencies and public benefit corporations participating in such contracts are required to make payments to the Fund.

Chapter 511 of the Laws of 1995 (as amended by Chapter 513 of the Laws of 1997, Chapter 655 of the Laws of 1999, Chapter 376 of the Laws of 2003 and Chapter 407 of the Laws of 2005) established the Fund.

3. Procedures and Agency Responsibilities:

The Fund is supported by transfers and deposits based on the value of contracts for construction and reconstruction, maintenance and repair, as defined in subdivision two of Section 220 of the Labor Law, into which all State agencies and public benefit corporations enter.

Chapter 407 of the Laws of 2005 increased the amount required to be provided to this fund to .10 of one-percent of the total cost of each such contract, to be calculated at the time agencies or public benefit corporations enter into a new contract or if a contract is amended. The provisions of this bill became effective August 2, 2005.

**To all State Departments, Agency Heads and Public Benefit Corporations
IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING PUBLIC WORK ENFORCEMENT FUND**

OSC will report to DOL on all construction-related ("D") contracts approved during the month, including contract amendments, and then DOL will bill agencies the appropriate assessment monthly. An agency may then make a determination if any of the billed contracts are exempt and so note on the bill submitted back to DOL. For any instance where an agency is unsure if a contract is or is not exempt, they can call the Bureau of Public Work at the number noted below for a determination. Payment by check or journal voucher is due to DOL within thirty days from the date of the billing. DOL will verify the amounts and forward them to OSC for processing.

For those contracts which are not approved or administered by the Comptroller, monthly reports and payments for deposit into the Public Work Enforcement Fund must be provided to the Administrative Finance Bureau at the DOL within 30 days of the end of each month or on a payment schedule mutually agreed upon with DOL.

Reports should contain the following information:

- Name and billing address of State agency or public benefit corporation;
- State agency or public benefit corporation contact and phone number;
- Name and address of contractor receiving the award;
- Contract number and effective dates;
- Contract amount and PWEF assessment charge (if contract amount has been amended, reflect increase or decrease to original contract and the adjustment in the PWEF charge); and
- Brief description of the work to be performed under each contract.

Construction Industry Fair Play Act

Required Posting For Labor Law Article 25-B § 861-d

Construction industry employers must post the "Construction Industry Fair Play Act" notice in a prominent and accessible place on the job site.

Failure to post the notice can result in penalties of up to \$1,500 for a first offense and up to \$5,000 for a second offense.

The posting is included as part of this wage schedule. Additional copies may be obtained from the NYS DOL website, www.labor.ny.gov.

WORKER NOTIFICATION

(Labor Law §220, paragraph a of subdivision 3-a)

Effective February 24, 2008

This provision is an addition to the existing prevailing wage rate law, Labor Law §220, paragraph a of subdivision 3-a. It requires contractors and subcontractors to provide written notice to all laborers, workers or mechanics of the *prevailing wage rate* for their particular job classification *on each pay stub**. It also requires contractors and subcontractors to *post a notice* at the beginning of the performance of every public work contract *on each job site* that includes the telephone number and address for the Department of Labor and a statement informing laborers, workers or mechanics of their right to contact the Department of Labor if he/she is not receiving the proper prevailing rate of wages and/or supplements for his/her particular job classification. The required notification will be provided with each wage schedule, may be downloaded from our website www.labor.state.ny.us or made available upon request by contacting the Bureau of Public Work at 518-457-5589.

* In the event that the required information will not fit on the pay stub, an accompanying sheet or attachment of the information will suffice.

OSHA 10-hour Construction Safety and Health Course – S1537-A

Effective July 18, 2008

This provision is an addition to the existing prevailing wage rate law, Labor Law §220, section 220-h. It requires that on all public work projects of at least \$250,000.00, all laborers, workers and mechanics working on the site, be certified as having successfully completed the OSHA 10-hour construction safety and health course. It further requires that the advertised bids and contracts for every public work contract of at least \$250,000.00, contain a provision of this requirement.

NOTE: The OSHA 10 Legislation only applies to workers on a public work project that are required, under Article 8, to receive the prevailing wage.

Requirements for OSHA 10 Compliance

Chapter 282 of the Laws of 2007, codified as Labor Law 220-h took effect on July 18, 2008. The statute provides as follows:

The advertised specifications for every contract for public work of \$250,000.00 or more must contain a provision requiring that every worker employed in the performance of a public work contract shall be certified as having completed an OSHA 10 safety training course. The clear intent of this provision is to require that all employees of public work contractors, required to be paid prevailing rates, receive such training “prior to the performing any work on the project.”

The Bureau will enforce the statute as follows:

All contractors and sub contractors must attach a copy of proof of completion of the OSHA 10 course to the first certified payroll submitted to the contracting agency and on each succeeding payroll where any new or additional employee is first listed.

Proof of completion may include but is not limited to:

- Copies of bona fide course completion card (*Note: Completion cards do not have an expiration date.*)
- Training roster, attendance record of other documentation from the certified trainer pending the issuance of the card.
- Other valid proof

**A certification by the employer attesting that all employees have completed such a course is not sufficient proof that the course has been completed.

WICKS Reform 2008

(For all contracts advertised or solicited for bid on or after 7/1/08)

- Raises the threshold for public work projects subject to the Wicks Law requiring separate specifications and bidding for the plumbing, heating and electrical work. The total project's threshold would increase from \$50,000 to: \$3 million in Bronx, Kings, New York, Queens and Richmond counties; \$1.5 million in Nassau, Suffolk and Westchester counties; and \$500,000 in all other counties.
- For projects below the monetary threshold, bidders must submit a sealed list naming each subcontractor for the plumbing, HVAC and electrical work and the amount to be paid to each. The list may not be changed unless the public owner finds a legitimate construction need, including a change in specifications or costs or use of a Project Labor Agreement (PLA), and must be open to public inspection.
- Allows the state and local agencies and authorities to waive the Wicks Law and use a PLA if it will provide the best work at the lowest possible price. If a PLA is used, all contractors shall participate in apprentice training programs in the trades of work it employs that have been approved by the Department of Labor (DOL) for not less than three years. They shall also have at least one graduate in the last three years and use affirmative efforts to retain minority apprentices. PLA's would be exempt from Wicks, but deemed to be public work subject to prevailing wage enforcement.
- The Commissioner of Labor shall have the power to enforce separate specification requirements on projects, and may issue stop-bid orders against public owners for non-compliance.
- Other new monetary thresholds, and similar sealed bidding for non-Wicks projects, would apply to certain public authorities including municipal housing authorities, NYC Construction Fund, Yonkers Educational Construction Fund, NYC Municipal Water Finance Authority, Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority, Westchester County Health Care Association, Nassau County Health Care Corp., Clifton-Fine Health Care Corp., Erie County Medical Center Corp., NYC Solid Waste Management Facilities, and the Dormitory Authority.
- Reduces from 15 to 7 days the period in which contractors must pay subcontractors.

Introduction to the Prevailing Rate Schedule

Information About Prevailing Rate Schedule

This information is provided to assist you in the interpretation of particular requirements for each classification of worker contained in the attached Schedule of Prevailing Rates.

Classification

It is the duty of the Commissioner of Labor to make the proper classification of workers taking into account whether the work is heavy and highway, building, sewer and water, tunnel work, or residential, and to make a determination of wages and supplements to be paid or provided. It is the responsibility of the public work contractor to use the proper rate. If there is a question on the proper classification to be used, please call the district office located nearest the project. District office locations and phone numbers are listed below.

Prevailing Wage Schedules are issued separately for "General Construction Projects" and "Residential Construction Projects" on a county-by-county basis.

General Construction Rates apply to projects such as: Buildings, Heavy & Highway, and Tunnel and Water & Sewer rates.

Residential Construction Rates generally apply to construction, reconstruction, repair, alteration, or demolition of one family, two family, row housing, or rental type units intended for residential use.

Some rates listed in the Residential Construction Rate Schedule have a very limited applicability listed along with the rate. Rates for occupations or locations not shown on the residential schedule must be obtained from the General Construction Rate Schedule. Please contact the local Bureau of Public Work office before using Residential Rate Schedules, to ensure that the project meets the required criteria.

Paid Holidays

Paid Holidays are days for which an eligible employee receives a regular day's pay, but is not required to perform work. If an employee works on a day listed as a paid holiday, this remuneration is in addition to payment of the required prevailing rate for the work actually performed.

Overtime

At a minimum, all work performed on a public work project in excess of eight hours in any one day or more than five days in any workweek is overtime. However, the specific overtime requirements for each trade or occupation on a public work project may differ. Specific overtime requirements for each trade or occupation are contained in the prevailing rate schedules.

Overtime holiday pay is the premium pay that is required for work performed on specified holidays. It is only required where the employee actually performs work on such holidays.

The applicable holidays are listed under HOLIDAYS: OVERTIME. The required rate of pay for these covered holidays can be found in the OVERTIME PAY section listings for each classification.

Supplemental Benefits

Particular attention should be given to the supplemental benefit requirements. Although in most cases the payment or provision of supplements is for each hour worked, some classifications require the payment or provision of supplements for each hour paid (including paid holidays on which no work is performed) and/or may require supplements to be paid or provided at a premium rate for premium hours worked.

Effective Dates

When you review the schedule for a particular occupation, your attention should be directed to the dates above the column of rates. These are the dates for which a given set of rates is effective. The rate listed is valid until the next effective rate change or until the new annual determination which takes effect on July 1 of each year. All contractors and subcontractors are required to pay the current prevailing rates of wages and supplements. If you have any questions please contact the Bureau of Public Work or visit the New York State Department of Labor website (www.labor.state.ny.us) for current wage rate information.

Apprentice Training Ratios

The following are the allowable ratios of registered Apprentices to Journey-workers.

For example, the ratio 1:1,1:3 indicates the allowable initial ratio is one Apprentice to one Journeyworker. The Journeyworker must be in place on the project before an Apprentice is allowed. Then three additional Journeyworkers are needed before a second Apprentice is allowed. The last ratio repeats indefinitely. Therefore, three more Journeyworkers must be present before a third Apprentice can be hired, and so on.
